PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: 6 LEVELS

English as a Second Language (ESL) applicants are administered the nationally recognized Cambridge Michigan Language Assessments (CaMLA) as a placement test. In-house speaking and writing exams are also conducted as part of placement test.

BEGINNER I - 101 / BEGINNER II - 102

The beginner level introduces students to both the spoken and written forms of the English language using modern methods. It provides basic grammar instruction through interactive activities in the classroom.

INTERMEDIATE I - 201 / INTERMEDIATE II - 202
